




Pilots & Case Studies

- SERIGO is co-creating five experimental pilot actions aimed at implementing socially innovative solutions and providing support to vulnerable groups in Austria, Estonia, Finland, Slovakia, and Slovenia.
- These pilots are empowering participants through **multi-actor co-creation laboratories**, improving social inclusion and encouraging active engagement within their communities.
- SERIGO is analysing empirical data from 24 case studies and 12 countries on social economy solutions implemented in local contexts. SERIGO will investigate framework conditions leading to social exclusion, drivers and potential of the social innovation in improving vulnerable groups' situation.

- Location: Villach, State of Carinthia, Austria
- Vulnerable group: Migrant and refugee women
- Solution: A programme tailored for marginalised mothers among refugee and migrant women. In partnership with the ReBoLA intercultural garden, this pilot action embraces a participatory approach. It supports women to self-organise and define their goals while offering basic literacy modules and workshops. The overarching aim is to develop a female self-empowerment network in the region.


