# Improving Access to Essential Services for Vulnerable Populations in Shirak, Armenia

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### Historical Background

- The Armenian Apostolic Church's social service was reborn after Armenia's independence.
- During the Soviet era, Church services were banned.
- Post-independence, time was needed to rebuild models and train specialists.

## Origins in Shirak

- The first experimental center was founded in the Shirak Diocese.
- Its success inspired about 15 similar centers in Armenia.
- These centers share a vision and values but operate independently.

#### Khachmeruk's Focus Areas

- We work in two interwoven directions:
- Adult education
- 2. Child protection
- The shared goal is improving socio-economic wellbeing.

#### Complexity of Vulnerability

- Root causes of vulnerability are many and complex.
- Addressing a single issue alone often leads to limited results.
- Holistic approaches show more sustainable impact.

### Why Holistic Matters

- Only 10–15% benefit long-term from isolated professional retraining.
- Working only with children without involving families may even cause harm.
- Sustainable change requires family-centered approaches.

#### Our Approach

- We treat the entire family as the beneficiary.
- Multidisciplinary teams conduct professional needs assessments.
- We identify both family-wide and individual strengths/needs.

#### The Social Change Plan

- Based on assessments, we create a joint change plan.
- It is a mutual agreement to tackle issues using all available resources.

#### Working Beyond Our Walls

- ▶ We can't solve all problems alone.
- We collaborate with:
- Local authorities
- State institutions
- Partner NGOs
- Clinics & service providers

### Connecting to State Services

- Social workers guide families to state programs:
- Housing
- Education access
- Medical care
- Social benefits

#### Value of Partnerships

- Our network greatly strengthens our work.
- Partnerships expand available services and create more complete support packages.

#### Challenges We Face

- ▶ 1. High demand vs. limited resources
- 2. Lack of regional social funds
- ▶ 3. Pressure from refugee crises since 2020

#### Structural Obstacles

- Absence of state programs for:
- Social housing
  - Guardianship
- Long-term family solutions
- NGOs can't fully substitute these needs.

- Despite challenges, our mission continues.
- We strive to build resilience through education, care, and collaboration.
- We believe in the transformative power of holistic social work.
