



The European Pillar of Social Rights Action Plan

European Pillar of Social Rights

- European Commission initiative from 2017
- proclaimed by EU Member States in 2017
- EU's compass to achieve greater social rights and better working and living conditions
- 20 principles in three chapters:
 - Equal opportunities and access to the labour market
 - Fair working conditions
 - Social protection and inclusion





Principle 3 **EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES**

Regardless of gender, racial or ethnic origin, religion or belief, disability, age or sexual orientation, everyone has the right to equal treatment and opportunities regarding employment, social protection, education, and access to goods and services available to the public.



Equal opportunities of under-represented groups shall be fostered.

Principle 17 INCLUSION OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

People with disabilities have the right to:

- income support that ensures living in dignity
- services that enable them to participate in the labour market and in society
- a work environment adapted to their needs



Principle 18 LONG-TERM CARE


Everyone has the right to affordable long-term care services of good quality, in particular homecare and community-based services.



Principle 19 HOUSING AND ASSISTANCE FOR THE HOMELESS

Access to **social housing or housing assistance** of good quality shall be provided for those in need.

Vulnerable people have the right to appropriate assistance and **protection against forced eviction**.



Adequate **shelter and services** shall be provided to the homeless in order to promote their social inclusion.

Some recommendations for Member States governments

European Child Guarantee Council recommendation:

- national implementation plans in six months
- progress monitored by the Commission

EU Roma Strategic Framework for equality & inclusion:

- national Roma strategic framework until September this year
- measures to fight discrimination and mainstream inclusion
- designate national and EU funds to achieve the goals



Pillar of Social Rights Action Plan

- published in March 2021

EU headline targets

At least 78% of the population aged 20 to 64 should be in employment by 2030.

At least 60% of all adults should participate in training every year by 2030.

NOW it is 37%

 The number of people at risk of poverty or social exclusion should be reduced by at least 15 million by 2030.

EU sub-targets on employment

- The gender employment gap should be at least halved compared to 2019.

 NOW it is 12%
- The provision of formal early childhood education and care should be increased.
- The rate of young people neither in employment, nor in education or training (NEETs) aged 15-29 should be decreased to 9%.

 NOW it is 12,6%

EU sub-targets on education & skills

 At least 80% of those aged 16-74 should have basic digital skills.

 Early school leaving should be further reduced and participation in upper secondary education increased.

EU sub-target on poverty reduction



18.3% of the EU population are children

Out of 15 million people to lift out of poverty or social exclusion, at least 5 million should be **children**.

NOW app 18 m children live in poverty



Porto Social Summit

- 7-8 May, 2021
- expected:
 - Council adoption of the EPSR Action Plan
 - Council adoption of the EU targets and sub-targets
 - MS commitment to adopt ambitious national targets and sub-targets
- importance of doing advocacy in the MSs around it

Potential advocacy goals and relevant timeframes 1.

Concerning EU targets and sub-targets

- to call on MS governments to officially commit to them in Porto
- in the coming 2 weeks

Concerning national targets and sub-targets

- to call on MS governments to set ambitious and relevant targets and sub-targets, going beyond the EU ones
- in the coming months; the sooner, the better



Potential national targets and sub-targets

Sweden:

CSRs 2019: "the school integration of foreign-born pupils, and the sustainable inclusion of the low-skilled and non-EU migrants (in particular women) into the labour market remain a challenge"

a sub-target on early school leaving of foreign-born pupils OR

a potential sub-target on the percentage of women from a migrant background in employment



Potential national targets and sub-targets

Austria:

CSRs 2019: "Learning outcomes for disadvantaged students have not improved. A wide performance gap remains between students with and without a migrant background." AND "...under-representation of women in management and supervisory positions."

a sub-target on decreasing the gap concerning the educational outcomes of students from disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged social background

OR

a potential sub-target on the percentage of women in management positions



Potential advocacy goals and relevant timeframes 2.

The Action Plan encourages MSs to **set up a coordination mechanism** to ensure the engagement of all relevant stakeholders in implementing the Pillar

- to call on MS governments to set up this mechanism and involve CSOs in the process from the planning phase to the evaluation phase
- after the Porto Summit
