With the European elections in 2024 approaching, Eurodiaconia will hold its first Social Policy Days to bring together its members with representatives of the European Institutions and partner organizations to discuss how to strengthen Social Europe.

In a time of permacrisis, 93% of Europeans say that the rising cost of living is currently their most pressing concern, and 82% concerned about increasing poverty and social exclusion strengthening social Europe needs to be a priority for legislators current and the future.

The 2024 European Parliament elections will be the 'litmus test' of how people feel institutions and leaders are addressing their concerns and will a challenge of policy and of democracy. We cannot continue with 'business as usual' and together we need to find ways to strengthen social protection systems and services, promote truly inclusive growth, and remove barriers to social wellbeing for all people in Europe.

Initiatives such as The European Pillar of Social Rights provides a strong basis for a more social and just Europe but there needs to be a deepening and completion of its implementation. Investment in social wellbeing needs to be prioritized as well as ensuring adequacy of coverage and value of social protection and services.

In this innovative event of roundtables and discussions we invite you to participate in all or some of the debates on offer.

- Scene setters what is needed to strengthen Social Europe? How could the European Parliament Elections in 2024 strengthen or weaken Social Europe?

 promote sustainable solutions modelled on Housing First and innovative supporting
 services.

- In collaboration with Social Services Europe we will have a roundtable *on social and sustainable public procurement*, looking at how to promote and prioritise social considerations when developing and commissioning social services.
- A roundtable on the challenge of implementing the Green Deal in the context of social service provision and how investment and rethinking of financing is needed.
